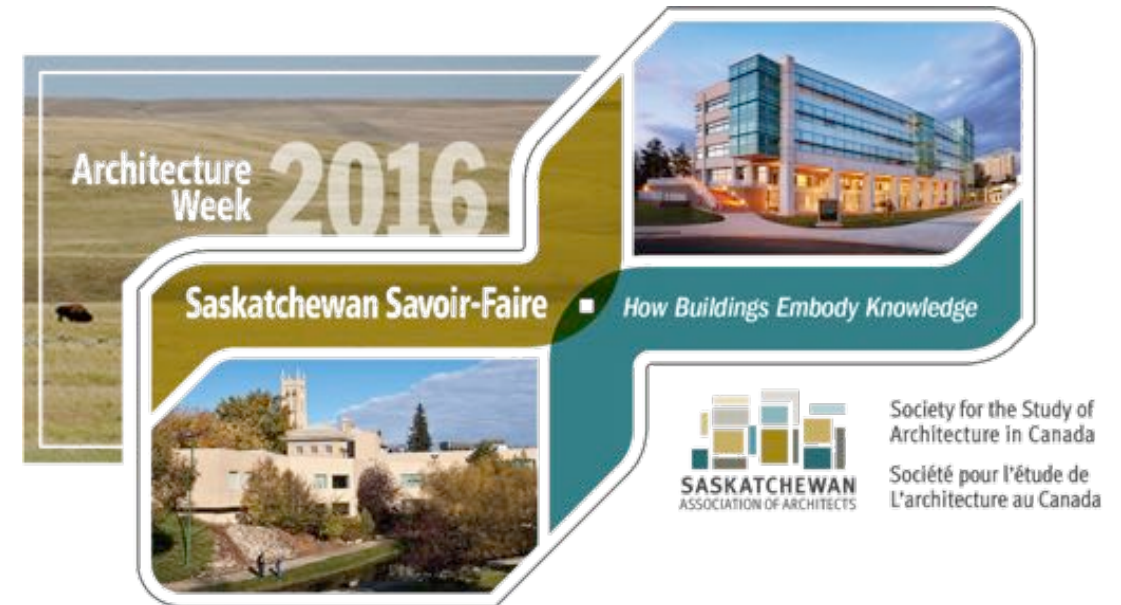

The 1958 competition for Toronto's new city hall and public square was the largest competition of its era, attracting more architects than even the 1956 Sydney Opera House competition. While the outcome is well known - Finnish-born architect Viljo Revell's complex opened to public acclaim in 1965 - what is lesser known to specialists and to the general public is the amazing variety of projects that were submitted from around the world. Weaving a tale that is equal parts civic, cultural, and architectural history, this richly illustrated publication explores the impact of the competition on the design of public institutions and urban spaces in Canada, and reflects upon the value of architectural competitions as modern architecture developed in the mid-20th century. Features a selection of over 50 official entries each illustrated with original drawings and models, as well as a complete listing of the more than 500 participating architects and architectural firms.

Saskatchewan's early twentieth century architecture conveys the optimism of this period. Whether sacred, civic, commercial or domestic, architecture conveyed Saskatchewan's savoir-faire and the pride of both new residents and the Dominion Government. This tour will survey architectural gems from the early 1900s in the railway town of Moose Jaw and the Francophone community of Gravelbourg to highlight the bright future envisioned in Saskatchewan's past.

KEYNOTE SPEAKER

SNØHETTA FIRM PROFILE

For over 25 years, Snøhetta has designed some of the world's most notable public and cultural projects including the new library of Alexandria, Egypt, the Norwegian National Opera in Oslo and the National September 11th Memorial Museum Pavilion at the World Trade Center in New York City. Since its inception, the practice has maintained its original self-defined trans-disciplinary approach, integrating architectural, landscape and interior design in all of its projects.

The are currently working on a number of civic and cultural projects internationally including the new Central Library in Calgary, Alberta, the recently completed expansion of the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art in California, the Far Rockaway Public Library in Queens, New York, the Isabel Bader Centre for the Performing Arts in Kingston, Ontario, the Ryerson University Student Learning Centre in Toronto, and the redevelopment of Times Square currently under construction in New York City. The firm is also one of seven firms shortlisted in the competition to design the Obama Presidential Center in Chicago, Illinois.



VANESSA KASSABIAN

Vanessa Kassabian is the Director of Design of Snøhetta's New York office. Vanessa is currently the Project Director of the New Central Library in Calgary, Canada, and has overseen the design of a number of large public projects including the Westchester Branch Library in the Bronx, part of the New York Public Library system; the Ryerson University Student Learning Centre in Toronto, Ontario; the Reconstruction of Times Square in New York City; the Isabel Bader Centre for the Performing Arts in Kingston, Ontario; the Guadalajara Museum of Environmental Sciences and Masterplan in Mexico; the Expansion of SFMOMA in San Francisco, California; and the James B. Hunt Library at North Carolina State University in Raleigh.

In addition to practice, Vanessa has served as a Visiting Professor at the School of Visual Arts in New York, and led a research-based design workshop at the University of Calgary's Faculty of Environmental Design titled *makeCalgary*, exploring the role of cultural space in Calgary's future development.
